# Election Guidelines for the 113th Academic Year Student Council President and Vice President

#### I. Basis

These guidelines are established in accordance with the Constitution of the Student Association of National Nanke International Experimental High School.

#### II. Purpose

- 1. Cultivate students' spirit of democracy, rule of law, and self-governance.
- 2. Foster students' self-management abilities, build a consensus of love for the school, enhance unity and harmony, and promote a positive school spirit.
- 3. Encourage students to actively organize and participate in school-wide activities, enriching campus life.

#### **III. Method of Election**

- 1. The election shall be conducted by universal, equal, and direct voting.
- 2. Eligible voters: All current students in Senior High School Grades 10–12 and Bilingual Department Grades 10–12.
- 3. The candidate with the highest number of votes shall be elected President (simple plurality system).
- 4. For uncontested elections, the candidate must receive at least 20% of the total eligible votes. Failure to meet this threshold will render the election invalid, and a new election must be held.

#### IV. Term of Office

From the day following the official announcement of election results by the Office of Student Affairs until June 30 of the following year.

#### **V. Candidate Qualifications**

- 1. First-year students in the Senior High School and Grade 10 students in the Bilingual Department.
- 2. A minimum overall average score of 60 or above in the first semester of Grade 10.
- 3. No record of demerits of 'Minor Demerit' or above prior to the registration deadline.
- 4. Recommendation from the homeroom teacher.
- 5. Enthusiastic about school affairs, possesses good conduct, and serves as a positive role model.

#### **VI. Candidate Registration Process**

## VII. Campaign Period and Regulations

- 1. Campaign Period: 2025/4/30 to 2025/5/23.
- 2. Campaigning must not interfere with class activities and is restricted to break times.
- 3. Campaigning is prohibited during morning self-study sessions and lunch breaks.
- 4. Be respectful when entering other classrooms.
- 5. Posters and promotional materials must not be posted arbitrarily; promotional materials must be properly removed to maintain campus cleanliness.

# **VIII. Public Presentation of Campaign Platforms**

Due to the lack of assembly time, an online campaign presentation will be considered after discussion with the candidates.

### **IX. Voting Procedure**

Date: 2025/5/23.
 Location: Online.

3. Time: Friday, from 9:00 AM to 2:20 PM.4. Method: Online voting, one vote per person.

# X. Ballot Counting Procedure

- 1. Time: Sixth period after voting concludes.
- 2. Location: Online; the ballot counting process will be livestreamed via Google Meet and recorded.
- 3. Ballot Counters: Staff members from the Office of Student Affairs.
- 4. Ballot Monitors: Members from the Student Council and the Office of Student Affairs.
- 5. Result Announcement: Results will be announced immediately after vote counting is completed.

# **XI. Special Regulations**

- 1. No campaigning is allowed on the day of voting.
- 2. Violations may be subject to disciplinary actions or assigned school service, depending on severity. Violations include but are not limited to:
- (1) Failure to follow teachers' instructions or disrupting the voting process on election day.
- (2) Election staff leaking confidential information before the election process concludes.
- (3) Candidates engaging in improper campaigning or failing to remove promotional materials within the designated time.

# XII. Implementation

These guidelines shall take effect upon approval by the Principal. Any revisions shall follow the same procedure.
